Oklahoma Has Some Incredible Main Street Communities!

- Across the U.S., many downtowns were not maintained and fell into disrepair from 1950s onward
- Communities have turned to revitalization programs (like Main Street) to put their town back on the map
- There are over 30 Oklahoma towns with an active Main Street Program
- Many other towns in the state still try to maintain and revitalize their downtown



Downtown is a great place for seniors

- It's convenient: everything is compact
- It's walkable: you don't need a car
- **It's pretty**: historic architecture and cultural heritage
- It's vibrant: where people young and old want to be
- It also keeps the housing market from going too stale: puts seniors into smaller downtown units while freeing up single-family houses for young families.



Wells Building Senior Apartments

Sapulpa, OK

- The building's façade/exterior were refurbished to the original 1900s aesthetic design
- The building's interior was demolished and renovated into state-of-the-art apartments.
- The building renovation project won awards for interior design, façade rehabilitation, and adaptive reuse
- The building contains over 30 units of senior housing and is located within a I-2 block radius of nearly all of Sapulpa's downtown businesses.



Some Room for Improvement

 Residents have not spent as much time downtown as originally anticipated.

- Why?
 - Business availability
 - Infrastructure
 - Perceived safety
 - Activities (inclusive of all ages)



Innovations in Downtown Livability

- Converting unused downtown buildings into senior housing is already innovative.
- Further innovations are needed to make downtowns more appealing for residents
- Biggest opportunities for improvement & innovation:
 - Incentivizing senior-friendly businesses
 - Livability upgrades to downtown infrastructure (sidewalks, parks/plazas)
